INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

- a) Manuscripts can be submitted in Spanish, English, German or French. Editors may consider to publish original papers in other languages under certain circumstances. Abstracts should be of no more than 200-300 words submitted at least in English and -whenever possible- in Spanish.
- b) Manuscripts should usually not exceed 20 A4 printed pages (29.5 x 21 cm), including figures and tables. If your work exceed this limit, please contact the editors. Submit the papers to arturo.morales@uam.es
- c) Accepted files formats:
 - c.1 Manuscript – .doc, .docx, .odt. Preferred text style: Times New Roman, size 12, justified alignment.
 - c.2 Figures – .TIFF, .EPS, .JPG (300 dpi minimum quality). Figures must be original and submitted as **separate files with the figure number** (Arabic numerals) indicated in the file name. Compound figures e.g. 1a, b, c must be submitted as one figure. Do not embed your figures in the manuscript file.
 - c.3 Tables: at the end of the manuscript or else as separate file as either spreadsheet file .xlsx, xls, .ods or text file .doc, .docx, .odt.
- d) Both figure captions and table legends must be listed and numbered with Arabic numerals and submitted on a separate file. Figure and table legends should be concise and informative. Please provide a list of figure captions and table legends at the end of the manuscript file.
- e) Papers should be organized as follows: Title, author's name(s), affiliation details and email address(es), Abstract (200-300 words), 5 Keywords, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgements, References. Results and Discussion may be treated together if this is appropriate. Non-experimental works can be organized in the way which the author(s) think(s) is the most appropriate one.
- f) In case supplementary material is provided, this will be submitted as a separate file named as appendix(ces) (use arabic numerals if more than one appendix is submitted).
- g) References should be quoted in the text as by the author's last name and year of publication within brackets - with comma between author and date, e. g., (Smith, 1992). For two-author papers, cite both authors (Smith & Jones, 1992); for papers by three or more authors, use (Martín et al., 1993.). For two or more papers with the same author(s) and date, use a, b, c, etc., after the date.
- h) All references cited in the text must be listed at the end of the paper alphabetically, cited complete and accurately. DOI for the reference should be included at the end of the reference when possible. References should be listed in the following style:
